The infants, as a rule, are very backward in Spelling, and very few (if any) of the elder infants are sufficiently advanced to at once commence the work of the first standard; but the standard children have a creditable knowledge of their work and have been well taught, except that their exercises in composition and Word-building have not made the elder children good spellers. The Recitation generally is good and the children are in good order."

The School accommodation is at present insufficient for the average attendance. This should be at once remedied or the Grant next year will be endangered (Article 85 (a) of the Code).
