School Inspected on May 24th 1912
The children are orderly and attentive and their general behaviour is quite satisfactory except that they might show a keener interest in their lessons.

The work generally reaches a fair standard of efficiency.

Reading in the Upper Group is fairly good
In the lower group it is relatively backward and the children do not make the best use of their time during private reading lessons.

In Written Composition the children express themselves fairly well. Their writing and spelling are also satisfactory.

In Oral work however they should be trained to speak with greater confidence and to make continuous statements.

The written Arithmetic is neat and fairly accurate but the children should be taught to rely more on their own powers.

and it is advisable to pay greater attention to oral and practical work.

The selection and arrangement of the objects for drawing lessons should follow a well considered plan.

The Needlework is good.

The Infant children are making fair progress, but the Instruction needs to be more stimulating. The Teacher does much for the children which they should learn to do for themselves.

The use of slates should be reduced to a minimum.
